

Annex B (This Annex is not part of the voluntary standard but is included for information only.)

Interpretations

This annex includes interpretations of this voluntary standard provided by ROHVA in response to written requests. The section numbers in this annex correspond to those used in the body of the standard.

4.17.2 Content - The Recreational Off-Highway Vehicle Association (ROHVA) received the exemplar hang tag and request for interpretation of ANSI/ROHVA 1-2016, Section 4.17.2.

Section 4.17.2 identifies the minimum content for the Tilt Table Test hang tag. It does not prohibit or require additional information.

In the exemplar hang tag, all of the requirements of Section 4.17.2 are met. The exemplar identifies the manufacturer or brand name and vehicle model, Tilt Table Test result, and there are warning statements, as required in Section 4.17.2.1. Next, it contains the statement in Section 4.17.2.2, albeit with additional explanatory language that the test result reflects the “[m]easurement of lateral stability, in degrees, of a sample, standard condition vehicle (with an operator and a passenger load – 430 pounds)”. This additional language helps clarify the information being provided. The TAP noted that while the exemplar uses “as measured”, and Section 4.17.2.2 uses “as determined”, that modification has the same meaning. Finally, the exemplar includes the statements set forth in Sections 4.17.2.3, 4.17.2.4, and 4.17.2.5.

Accordingly, the exemplar is consistent with and fully meets the requirements of Section 4.17.2.

Section 4.17.2 and exemplar hangtag shown below:

4.17.2 Content. Every hang tag shall contain the content as listed in Section 4.16.4.5.1. In addition, the hang tag shall contain the following:

- 4.17.2.1** Tilt Table Test information (Section 8.1.3(3)(c), including the manufacturer or brand name and vehicle model, Tilt Table Test results (Section for that vehicle based on tilt table angle at two-wheel lift (static)), and warning statements.
- 4.17.2.2** The statement – “Lateral stability as determined by the manufacturer in accordance with the tilt table lateral stability test in the ANSI/ROHVA standard for Recreational Off-Highway Vehicles.”
- 4.17.2.3** The statement – “Training courses to teach ROV driving are available. For information contact your dealer or rohva.org.”
- 4.17.2.4** The statement – “Check with your dealer to find out about state or local laws regarding ROV operation.”
- 4.17.2.5** The statement – “This hang tag is not to be removed before sale.”

Tilt Table Test Result

Be Prepared

- Fasten seat belts.

Rollovers have caused severe injuries and death, even on flat, open areas.

Be Sure Riders Pay Attention and Plan Ahead

- If you think or feel the vehicle may tip or roll, reduce your risk of injury:
- Keep a firm grip on the steering wheel or handholds and brace yourself.
 - Do not put any part of your body outside of the vehicle for any reason.

Require Proper Use of Your Vehicle

- Do your part to prevent injuries:
- Do not allow careless or reckless driving.
 - Make sure operators are 16 or older with a valid driver's license.
 - Do not let people drive or ride after using alcohol or drugs.
 - Do not allow operation on public roads (unless designated for off-highway vehicle access) – collisions with cars and trucks can occur.
 - Do not exceed seating capacity: [X] passenger(s).
